HLTH 104

Personal Health

3 CCC College Credits

An in-depth course in maintaining lifelong good health examines emotional health, drug education, family health, personal fitness, disease, consumer, and environmental health.

SOC 101

Introductory Sociology

3 CCC College Credits

Introduces sociology as a science concerned with relationships, institutions, organizations, and the physical environment. Outlines the major theories as a basis for sociological perspectives on social issues. Covers the origins of sociology as a science, diverse patterns of social organization from a global perspective, the nature and substance of cultural systems and social institutions, and sociological perspectives in analyzing trends in human society.

PSY 101

Introductory Psychology

3 CCC College Credits

Basic orientation to the psychology of human behavior. Studies the aims and methods of psychological investigation and measurement, and biological and social influences on behavior. It also focuses on learning, motivation, emotion, perception, and personality development.

All courses are college-level courses and have expectations of college-level students. These courses are rigorous and expectations are high. Students must be motivated and diligent in their course work. Citi provides an online learning specialist to oversee students enrolled in an online course and will regularly check in with students.

Transferring Credit:

- These courses are transferable to a SUNY institution with a final grade of "C" or better.
- CCC has agreements with many colleges and universities to accept these credits but some private institutions have strict policies regarding transferring credits.
- Students are encouraged to contact the admissions department at the college of their choice to verify credit transferability.
- Interested students should meet with their school counselor to register.

Who can take these courses?

2023-2024 Juniors and Seniors.

How much time is required for each class?

These classes are normally 45 hours a semester at college. Virtual Summer College is only offered during a 5-week period. These classes are extremely rigorous and time intensive. A minimum of 9 hours are required per week to complete each class.

How many courses can a student take during virtual summer college?

Students are only allowed to take one course during this 5-week period. Students interested in taking more than one course must have school counselor and school administrator permission to enroll in a second course.

How much does an online course cost?

Virtual Summer College is at no cost to the student.
